Nostitz, coat of arms. Families belonging to the coat of arms: Choczowski, Nostitz or Nostycz

Nostitz - a noble  $\underline{family}$  from  $\underline{Upper\ Lusatia}$ , who spread  $\underline{Silesia}$ , the  $\underline{Czech\ Republic}$  and  $\underline{Poland}$  quite early on .

The Lords of Nostitz have been registered in their ancestral seat in Nostitz ( <u>Obere Nosaćica</u>) - today a district of the town of <u>Weißenberg - since 1280</u>. In 1439 Nostitz was sold by the family. The family was divided into three branches:

- 1. Unworthiness (near <u>Kittlitz</u> ) with the <u>line</u> Unworthiness and <u>Cunewalde</u> ,
- 2. Ullersdorf (near Jänkendorf) with two lines: Ullersdorf and Schönbrunn (the latter includes the Silesian lines

- Mitsch, Ransau, Lampertsdorf and Zedlitz) and
- 3. Rothenburg with the Rothenburg, Guttau and Tzschocha lines . The actual line of the Rothenburg Nostitz family began with Caspar von Nostitz (d. 1484), whose three sons Hartwig, Georg and Otto (I.) founded the later heavily branched lines of Tzschoch, Guttau and Rothenburg.

#### **Czech Republic**

#### Jan Hertwik Nostitz (1610-1683)

Zweig The Czech Graf from comes the Czoch line established by Hertwik von Nostitz . His great-grandson Johann von Nostitz (died 1619), chairman of the regional council of the Duchy of Wola, left two sons, Otto (II) and Johann Hartwig; from the former comes the Rokytnice line, which was given the title of baron in 1681, the title of Bohemian count in 1675 and the title of imperial count (imperial count) in 1692. In 1890 o'clock. Józefie the line ended Nostic (1821at 1890).

The founder of the Rieneck line was the second son of the aforementioned Johann von Nostitz. Jan Hertwik Nostic (1610 Wińsko -1683), who acted as a true privy supreme chancellor of councilor and the Republic. He received **Sokolov** in his will after Otto von Nostitz (III.) . In 1631 he became Baron Sokolov, in 1641 a Czech graphemaker, in 1651 an imperial graph and in 1673 he invested in part of the County Rieneck. Pakoměřice Castle became the headquarters of the Nostitz-Rieneck line, and after the Měšice Castle was built in 1775, the family moved there. After the Second World War, the Counts of Nostitz-Rieneck were deported from Czechoslovakia to Austria and their property was confiscated.

Silesia, from 1711 the Count's branch comes from the Ransauser branch of the House of Mitsch. The Prussian general <u>August Ludwig von Nostitz</u> comes from this line. The coat of arms of the Nostitz family shows a red and silver checkered bull horn in a blue field. On the helmet with a red and silver cover of the horns.

# Garczyński coat of arms (vol. 4 pp. 68-73)

Garczynski coat of arms. MRS. Hemp. A jewel named Calatowa is struck for their coat of arms. MRS, about Familiach Prus. they are attracted by the Junosz coat of arms. The Sas coat of arms is known in the genealogy on the Krasiński engraving card; it bears a great resemblance to the jewel of Sas, after all with a different symmetry you find it here, ie an arrow pointing straight up at an iron angle, above the moon with horns on a new moon; lowered, and the arrows on the sides of the moon on this side and on the other, on a star, four ostrich feathers over the helmet, so I saw it; on P. 69] the home seal of one of them, the same was given by Fr. Mikołaj Garczyński Soc. He was born in this house and added that his name was Cholewa, or it was different from the Cholewa coat of arms, and in Kazan it is faked like that at his funeral. Rzeszowski, but elsewhere I saw only three feathers on the helmet through which the arrow ironically steers towards the right target. Brantovna was one of those families behind him. Jedrzej Richter Tczweski, brother of our Br. Mikołaj, died around 1667. I read Boouslaw 1668. in in Residential Mariaeburg. Samson, Ensign Chełmiński, said goodbye to this world in 1667. Tuchołczanka, the elder Jasieniecka, and among them his Franciszek. Franciszek is Damian's son fourth son.
