Prus II. In a red field two silver scythes, pointing inward, the points pointing upwards crossing, the lower ends meeting together are held together with a golden band, one end of which hangs down. The scythes are set at the top between the tips with the sesqui-cross from the coat of arms of Prus I . ; Helm adornment: the same arm as in Prus I. The coat of arms was probably also called Wilczekosy (wolf's iron) because scythes folded together in this way were commonly used as wolf 's shackles . About the origin of this coat of arms it is said: At the time of King Kazimierz the Monk (1041 58) rebelled against this Maslaus, Voivode of Mazovia, in order to make himself Lord of Mazovia. The king entrusted the supreme command over the Polish troops sent against him to a knight of the Prus I coat of arms, it is also said to be one of the three Prussian princes to whom this coat of arms was granted. This struck and destroyed the Maslaus. As a reward he asked for the hand of the only daughter of the deceased Maslaus from the king, who had no objection and presented him with many estates in Mazovia. He now also combined the coat of arms of Maslaus, the two scythes (wilczekosy) with his own. This coat of arms is used by:

The noble Polish family Prus I

Prus I. A floating, silver double high cross in a red field, but the lower left bar is missing; Helmet adornment: an armored arm, armed with a sword, leaning on the crown with the elbow. About the origin it is said: Soon after the conversion attempt of St. Adalbert in Prussia, where he was murdered in 997, several Prussians came to Poland to accept Christianity and stay here. So did three Prussian princes who received this coat of arms and landed property in the Kraków Voivodeship from King Boleslaw. The other arrivals and later the captured Prussians who wanted to stay in the country were also settled there in colonies. The resulting estates and colonies were all called Prusy (Prussia) after the nationality of the current owners, and this also became the name of the coat of arms and the family of the Prussian princes who were enfeoffed. However, around 1500 the general designation Prus came into use instead of Prusy. From this coat of arms emerged the coats of arms Prus II and III. A descendant of these princes and bearer of this coat of arms was St. Stanislaw from Szczepanowo, Bishop of Kraków, who was murdered by King Boleslaw in 1079. The later very numerous descendants of the family line to which St. Stanislaw belonged in the Kraków Voivodeship included in their coat of arms a small crosier, which they placed on the right side of the cross, to confirm their kinship with the same. They named this new coat of arms Turzyna, which became Turzyna. However, since the end of the 15th century the Turzyna have probably returned to their ancestral coat of arms, because this name fell into disuse. The coat of arms of Prus I are carried by:
