
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Welcome to London!




Great, we're in London! London is both the biggest city in England and the most densely populated city in the European Union. Almost eight million people live in its 33 boroughs. And there are more than two hundred parks where they can relax and have fun.

London is also the capital of England and the United Kingdom, which is made up of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

The Queen is the head of state and lives at Buckingham Palace, but the Prime Minister is the head of government.

Parliament meets in the Palace of Westminster, which is therefore also known as the Houses of Parliament. The building has two large towers, Victoria Tower and the Clock Tower, where five huge bells chime. One of these bells is called Big Ben and is the third-heaviest bell in England, which is why the whole tower is often referred to as Big Ben.
